Opportunity to gain level 3 qualifications which can:

- Give you access to university to study at degree level
- Give you access to complete an apprenticeship at a level 3 (advanced) or level 4 (higher/degree level)
- Provide more opportunities in the workplace and a wider choice
- Join the armed forces at officer level
- University graduates in England had an average annual salary of £42,000 pounds a year in 2024, £11,500 higher than the average salary for non-graduates.



Pathways on offer:





IBCP:

- 2 x IB subjects
- 1 or 2 vocational (BTEC) subjects
- Reflective Project
- Language and Cultural Studies
- Personal and Professional skills
- Community Engagement





T Level:

Legal, Finance, and Accounting

- Alternative to completing A-levels, IB course, or vocational courses.
- Equivalent to three A-levels.
- Minimum of 45 days of an industry placement.
- Core content and occupational specialism:
 - Finance retail and commercial banking analyst



Technical qualification

Between 900-1400 hours

Core (20-50%)

- Knowledge of underpinning concepts, theories, principles and the core workplace skills relevant to the T level.
- Assessed through an external examination and a substantial employer-set project.

Occupational Specialisms (50-80%)

- Knowledge and skills required to achieve threshold competence¹ in an occupational specialism.
- Maths, English and digital skills included where they are necessary to achieve threshold competence.
- Students must complete at least one occupational specialism.
- Assessed synoptically through rigorous practical assignments.

Industry Placement

Between 315-420 hours

- · Undertaken with an external employer
- · Minimum of 45-60 days
- Students develop technical skills and apply their knowledge in a workplace environment
- Provider should pay for/contribute to travel and subsistence costs, if not covered by the employer

Maths, English and digital requirements

- Students must achieve a level 2 in maths and English, or higher levels determined by T level panels²
- Relevant digital skills developed through the technical qualification (as above)

Other requirements set by T level panels

e.g. licence to practise qualification of professional registration

Any further employability, enrichment and pastoral requirements






